What is Phonological Awareness? - Super Duper

- Play traditional hand-clapping games such as "Patty Cake" and "Miss Mary Mack"
- Gather paper and crayons and have your child draw a picture of a rhyming sentence such as "Dad is glad," or "A frog sat on the log"

Talk about the rhyming words and how they sound alike Have the child think of other words that

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gonna miss me when I'm gone " A new hand-clapping game — similar to schoolyard classics such as "Miss Mary Mack" and "Slide" and "Down by the Banks" — was spreading through the school It was being transmitted from student to student, face to face, as in the old days Inside of a week, the rhythm became ubiquitous

Grades 4 - 6 Non-Equipment Activities

Teach the song first with hand signals The tune is the same for every line ("soh, lah, ti, doh, doh, doh") Actions: Cross arms to shoulders Pat thighs Clap hands together Clap partner right, clap together, clap partner left, clap together Add in leg squats or jumps with this as they become more proficient Song: Miss Mary Mack, Mack, Mack,
